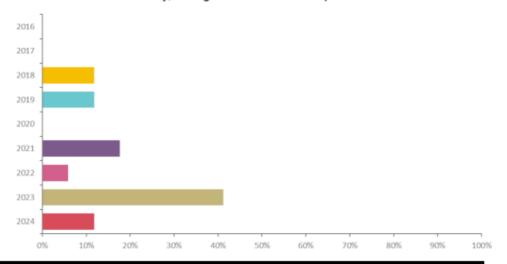

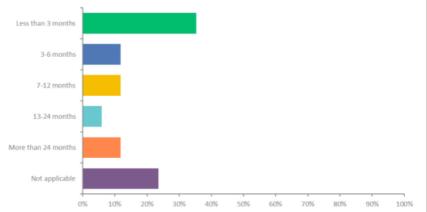
2024 WONGU ALUMNI SURVEY REPORT

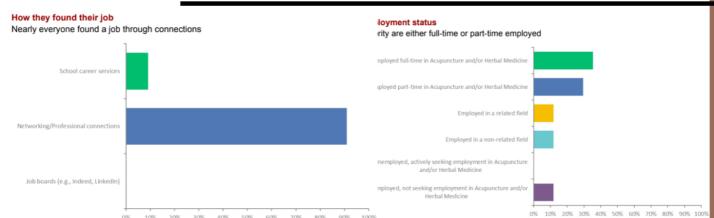
Year graduated

Here is a summary of their answers from open-ended questions

For program improvement:

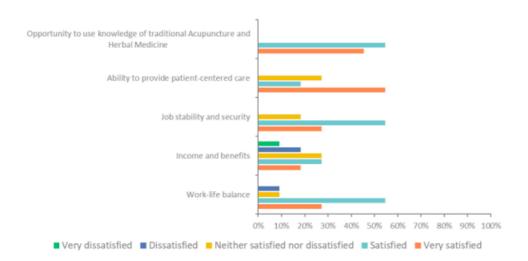
- · Strengthen clinical training

My clinical specialties include Sports Medicine Acupuncture and Reproductive Medicine. I'm passionate about helping athletes and active individuals optimize performance, accelerate recovery, and stay in peak condition. I also love supporting people on their fertility journey or navigating hormonal transitions. No matter the concern pain, fatigue, stress, or hormonal imbalance—I offer a personalized, whole-person approach rooted in both tradition and evidenceinformed care.

When I'm not in the clinic, I'm usually training hard in the gym, hiking desert trails, cycling with my husband Nate, or carving turns on the mountain. We share a love of adventure, movement, and creative expression, and our hearts are ruled by our sweet Siberian Coon, Charlie, who brings a calming presence to our home.

Liu Yi San (六一散), also known as "Sixto-One Powder," Invented in 1172 AD, it belongs to the category of formulas that dispel Summer-Heat and resolve Dampness.

"In Chinese Medicine health conditions are thought to arise due to "disharmonies" in the body as a system. These disharmonies are called "patterns" and the very purpose of herbal formulas is to fight them in order to restore the body's harmony.

In this case Liu Yi San is used by TCM practitioners to fight patterns like Summer-Heat or Damp-Heat in the Bladder. From a Western Medicine standpoint, such patterns can give rise to a range of conditions such as stomach flu, gastroenteritis or heatstroke for instance."
