Licensure in Other States

Completion of the Wongu University Masters in Oriental Medicine (MSOM) program is accepted for licensure in most states but does not guarantee state licensure eligibility alone. The general licensure requirements are:

Nevada and most states require passage of some or all of the National Commission for Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine (NCCAOM) exam modules (<u>https://www.nccaom.org/certification/nccaomcertification-eligibility/</u>) and the Council of Acupuncture and Herbal Medicine (CCAHM) Clean Needle Technique (CNT: <u>https://www.ccahm.org/ccaom/Overview.asp</u>) exam for licensure.

Like Nevada, many states require a state-specific exam in jurisprudence or other areas of statespecific laws in addition to the NCCAOM exam modules. It is recommended to check state licensure requirements prior to applying for an acupuncture license as the legislation changes frequently.

Wongu University Masters in Oriental Medicine program is accepted for licensure in all states except:

 California: California requires completion of a program approved by the California Acupuncture Board (CAB; https://www.acupuncture.ca.gov/) and successfully passing the California Acupuncture exam to qualify for licensure. Additional Training Required

In addition to the MSOM program, additional training is required in the following states:

- Florida requires a 60-hour injection therapy course.
- Massachusetts requires one laboratory course in general biology or anatomy and physiology as part of the master's program. Wongu offers the courses but not the laboratory component.
