MEET OUR MARKETING TEAM!

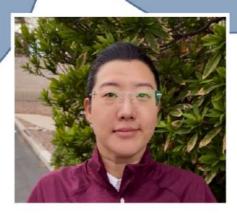

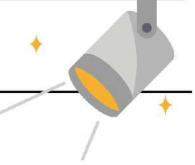

HERBAL HIGHLIGHTS!

AI YE MUGWORT LEAF



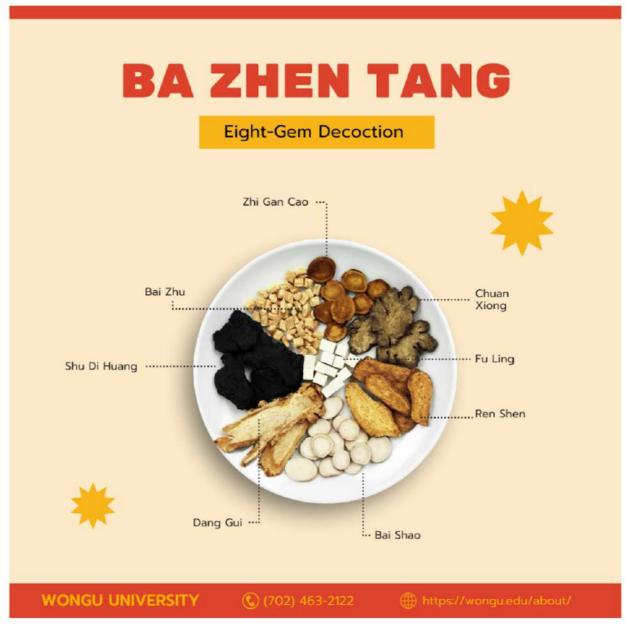
Ai Ye (Mugwort Leaf), also known as Moxa, can be seen in many Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM) clinics. Its properties are acrid, bitter, and warm. It enters the kidney, liver, and spleen channels. It is commonly used to warm the womb, stop prolonged menstrual bleeding, to treat lower abdominal pain related to menstruation, and aid in infertility.

It is used often for moxibustion for tonification and movement of stagnant qi or used as a topical to treat skin rashes.



Shan Zhu Yu (Asiatic Cornelian Cherry Fruit) is sour and warm. It enters the kidney and liver. It tonifies the liver and kidney yin and strengthens kidney yang, stabilizes the kidneys and astringes jing and body fluids, stops excessive sweating and supports that which has collapsed, and stabilizes the menses and stops bleeding.

Its common dosage is 3-12g and shock dosage is 30-60g. Discretion: Please check Wongu Health Center for proper dosage and use or join the team at Wongu!



Ba Zhen Tang, or Eight-Gem Decoction, boosts qi and supplements blood.

Ba Zhen Tang is intended for a syndrome of qi and blood deficiency marked by pale or withered-yellow complexion, dizziness, auditory vertigo, fatigued limbs, shortness of breath, reluctance to speak, palpitations, and decreased food intake. The tongue is pale with a thin, white coating and the pulse is thready, weak or deficient, big, and weak. This formula includes Ginseng Root (Ren Shen), White Atractylodis (Bai Zhu), Poria (Fu Ling), Chinese Angelica Root (Dang Gui), Sichuan Lovage Rhizome (Chuan Xiong), White Peony Root (Bai Shao), Baked Rehmannia Root (Shu Di Huang), and Baked Licorice Root (Zhi Gan Cao).
